Trifolium repens



Riesling is a medium to large leafed white clover with high stolon density and excellent production. It has excellent adaptability to a wide range of environments. It is broadly used across Europe and New Zealand. Riesling contributes to pasture mixture yields by providing nitrogen for the grasses and through its own biomass production.

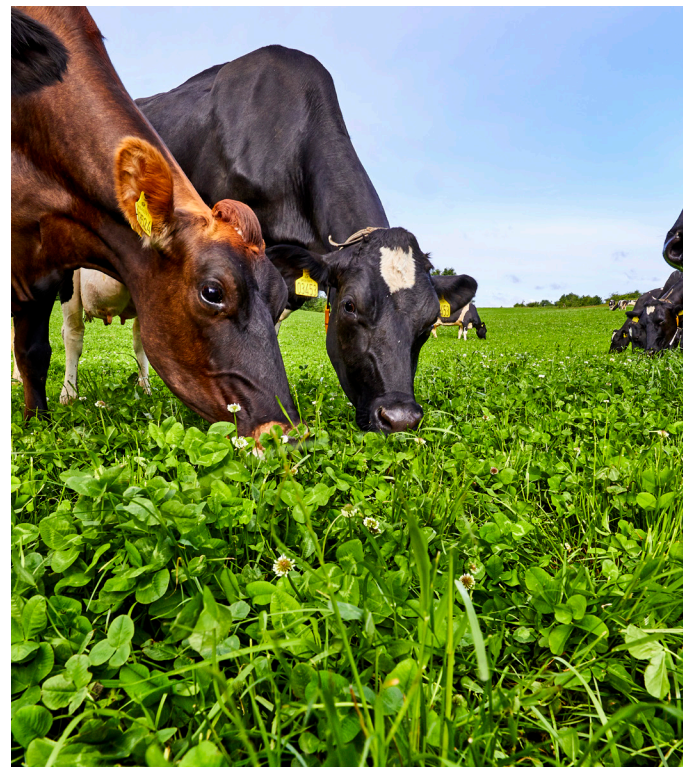
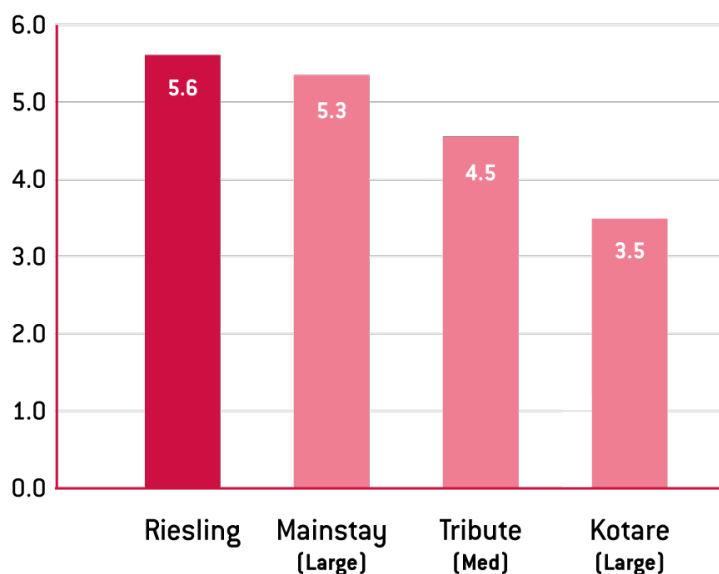
Riesling can be used in seed mixtures for new seedings and can be used for overseeding existing pastures. Riesling has impressed farmers with its vigor and its ability to maintain high clover content in pastures, under a wide range of farm types.

- Very persistent under grazing and cutting
- Maintains excellent ground cover

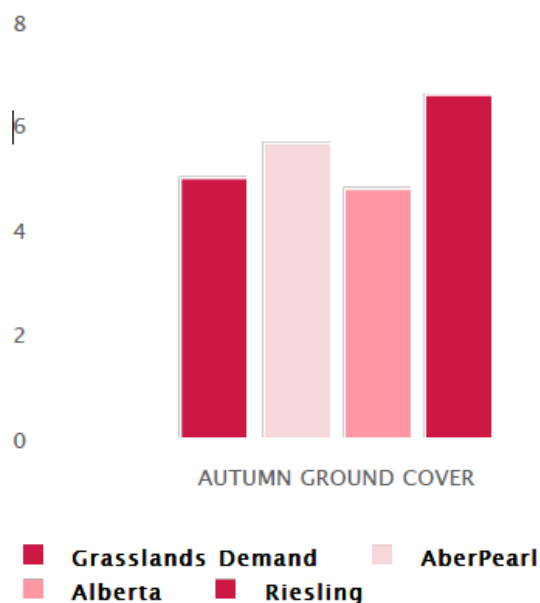

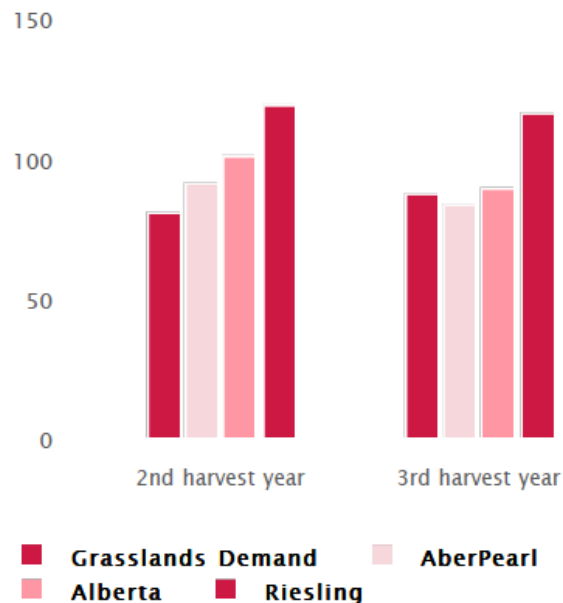
